DCU FuJo Postdoctoral Fellowships 2025 EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

Call Description

DCU's Institute of Media, Democracy and Society (FuJo) is pleased to announce this call for expressions of interest for the 2 year European Postdoctoral Fellowships under Horizon Europe's Marie Skłodowska-Curie Action. This competitive scheme, fully funded by the European Commission, aims to support postdoctoral researchers in advancing their careers through independent research, mobility, and professional development.

FuJo is particularly interested in this grant to further its research in discourse studies, hate speech, disinformation, AI in political discourse, journalism, media industry developments, and digital authoritarianism, aligning with its mission to explore the intersections of technology, media, and democratic values.

The deadline for submissions is 10 September 2025, 17:00 CEST / 7PM GMT.

To be eligible, you *must hold a PhD degree* and *not have carried out your main activity (work or study) or lived in the Republic of Ireland for 12 months in the 3 years prior to the call* deadline. Interested individuals who believe they meet these eligibility criteria are requested to complete the Expression of Interest form.

This form will be reviewed by the FuJo team and relevant supervisors, which will check eligibility, alignment with project priorities and proposed supervisor's research interest, and experience.

Selected applicants will receive support from the supervisor in developing a competitive research proposal for this scheme.

This form will be used to collect Expression of Interests (EoIs) for this FuJo MSCA call. The information will be electronically shared with the supervisor(s) and the FuJo team. EoIs will be stored until 10 October, after which unsuccessful application details will be securely deleted. You may request your information to be deleted at any time by contacting fujo@dcu.ie.

Academics and Research Focus

Dr Alessio Cornia is an Associate Professor at Dublin City University and Research Associate at the Reuters Institute for the Study of Journalism, University of Oxford. He is member of Fujo's Steering Committee, where he leads the strand on Journalism and the News Industry. His research interest is comparative research on political communication and journalism, with a focus on the relationship between media and politics, news industry developments, digital news, social media platforms, media coverage of corruption, and EU journalism. Cornia led and participated in several collaborative research projects, including the EU-funded project 'CO.R.E.: Corruption Risk indicators in Emergency' and the H2020 project 'MEDIATIZED EU: Mediatized Discourses on Europeanization and Their Representations in Public Perceptions'.

Dr Eileen Culloty is an Assistant Professor in the School of Communications and Deputy Director of the DCU Institute for Media, Democracy, and Society. Her research explores the quality of the media-information environment with a focus on disinformation and its countermeasures, media literacy, and the future of public media. She leads the Ireland Hub of the European Digital Media Observatory (EDMO) and serves as Co-Chair of Media Literacy Ireland. In 2024, she was appointed to Ofcom's Making Sense of Media Research, Evidence and Evaluation Working Group.

His projects have been funded by EU's Horizon Europe, the Irish Research Council (2022 & 2024) and Royal Irish Academy/British Academy, among others.

She is also an Executive Board member of ECREA (European Communication Research and Education Association).
